New Water Tower at Higgins/Busse

The Village is proud to unveil its new 155-foot-tall, elevated water storage tank, also known as a water tower. Located at the intersection of Higgins Road and Busse Road, the new Higgins/Busse Water Tower will replace the 121-foot tall water tower on Pratt Boulevard that was built in 1964.

This modern facility plays a crucial role in maintaining water system pressure. The increased height provides more pressure in the system and its 500,000 gallon capacity will help manage peak demand, thus improving water service to our local businesses.

Additionally, the new water tower proudly features the Makers Wanted logo, a distinctive element that will promote the Elk Grove Village Business Park to the over 140,000 vehicles that drive down I-90 every day.

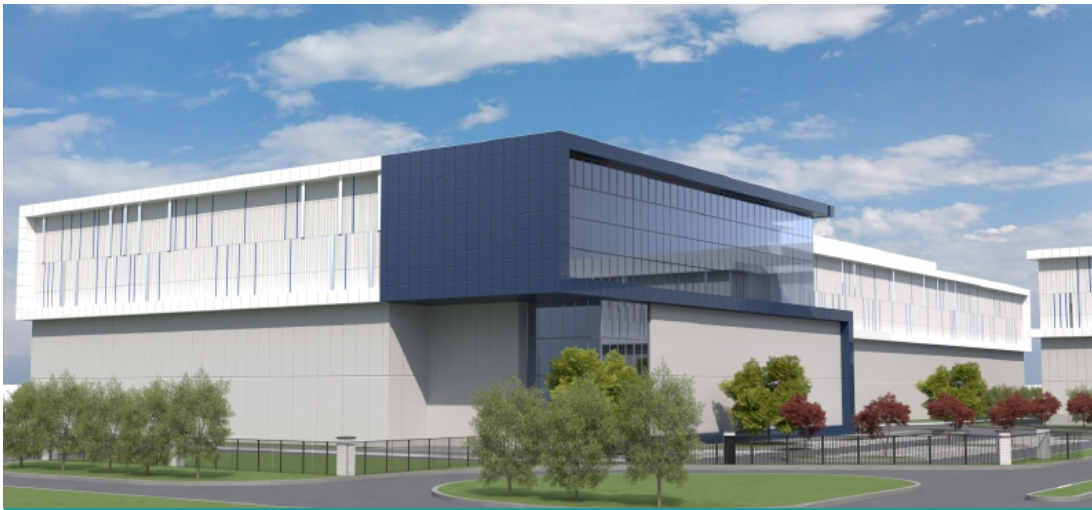
Beyond the workplace, Rich and his team are invested in giving back to the community through the Elk Grove Township Angel Tree and Food Pantry, among other organizations. ■

Business Ambassador Visit: Elk Grove Veterinary Specialty & Emergency

The Business Ambassador Team had the opportunity to meet the staff at Elk Grove Veterinary Specialty & Emergency, located at 1050 Bonaventure Drive. They are a pet hospital that provides emergency care and planned surgeries for cats and dogs and are open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.

When a pet has an urgent need and a family's regular veterinarian is unavailable, their team is ready to help. Accidents occur with pets, and some of the typical conditions they treat include vomiting and diarrhea, toxic or foreign body ingestion, seizures, and traumatic injuries.

Their hospital has everything necessary to assist dogs and cats in need of immediate care, including in-house blood work, x-rays, ultrasound, and other diagnostic tools to help identify the problem, develop a treatment plan, and provide care or hospitalization. They have over 40 team members on staff, including seven emergency-trained doctors, a Board-Certified Criticalist, a Board-Certified Surgeon, and 15 certified veterinary technicians.

The Ambassador Team enjoyed meeting with the Elk Grove Veterinary Specialty & Emergency team and learning about this great resource for pet owners available in our own backyard. ■

Village Board Approves Updated Zoning Code

For the last several years, the Village has worked to modernize and enhance the existing Zoning Ordinance for the Village. A new Zoning Ordinance was passed at the December 12, 2023 Village Board Meeting and replaced the former Zoning Ordinance in its entirety on January 1, 2024.

The Community Development Department, in collaboration with the Village Manager's Office, the Village Attorney, and the Village's zoning consultant, created a modernized Zoning Code to reflect the current best practices in zoning and development regulations which align with the vision and future of the community.

As part of this process, the Village completed initial assessments, hosted a community open house, undertook staff review workshops, held Steering Committee review and policy direction meetings, and conducted a legal review.

Following this assessment and public feedback period, the Plan Commission and Zoning Board of Appeals held a joint public hearing on the proposed Zoning Ordinance on November 7, 2023. Both committees unanimously recommended approval to the Village Board.

The updated Zoning Code simplifies the construction processes for residents and businesses, and offers clear and concise requirements with updated graphics, tables, and charts to make the process smoother and more understandable.

Executive Order Passed to Prevent Unscheduled Bus Arrivals

On Tuesday, January 9, Mayor Johnson signed an Executive Order to create new regulations for the Village that will serve to discourage unscheduled bus arrivals. Owners, operators, or drivers of any bus that is not providing regularly scheduled service that would like to make a stop or drop off passengers in Elk Grove Village now must file an application with the Director of Police at least five calendar days prior to the proposed drop-off date. Any person violating the provisions within the Executive Order are subject to arrest and shall be fined upon conviction. Additionally, the bus shall be immediately seized and impounded.

The Village is committed to protecting the health, safety, and welfare of individuals residing in and visiting Elk Grove Village. Dropping off passengers without prior provisions made for their proper housing and care is inhumane and can have deadly consequences in adverse weather conditions. Such drop-off incidents can increase demand on Village resources, which can threaten public safety and welfare. ■

No one likes to get into a freezing car, but cold weather is a prime time for warm-up thefts. This is when thieves steal cars that have been left running to warm up while unlocked and unattended.

If you must warm up your car unattended, use a remote starter or lock your vehicle and use a spare key. It only takes seconds for a thief to strike anywhere, including residential areas, driveways, convenience stores, and gas stations.

Clearmont Pedestrian Bridge Closed Until Late Spring

The Clearmont Pedestrian Bridge is now closed until the completion of the new bridge in May or June. The new bridge will be 400 feet long, twice as long as the old bridge, which will remove the structure from the floodplain, reducing flooding, and eliminating closures of the bridge.

The new bridge will be 14 feet wide to accommodate cyclists pulling trailers and create better shared space for both cyclists and pedestrians. The new steel truss bridge will include new pathway lighting, aesthetic improvements, and an overlook for pedestrians to view wildlife. ■

Keep Windshields Clear This Winter!

Remember to always clear snow and fully defrost your car windows (windshield, back and side windows) before you start driving for full visibility of the roads! This important action can help keep you and your family safe this winter.

Also, remember to:

- Keep your windshield washer full of de-icing fluid to easily clear dirt, salt and slush while driving during the winter months.
- Replace wipers when needed – if your windshield isn't getting clean, it may be time for new wipers. ■

Elk Grove Village's Snow and Ice Control

Winter is here and the Village is ready to provide safe and clear streets. To help achieve our goal, please keep in mind the following:

► Priority Plowing and Salting

During snow/ice events, Public Works crews focus on major streets first to provide access for emergency vehicles and heavier traffic, then begin working on all other streets. Crews will continue this process for the duration of the storm and come back to clean up side streets after the snowfall has ended.

► Your Role in Clearing Snow

Snow removal equipment is designed to push snow onto the right-of-way which may result in snow being pushed onto driveway aprons, mailboxes, sidewalks, and hydrants. Residents and businesses are encouraged to clear:

- **Driveway aprons and mailboxes** – Place the snow onto your property or the adjacent parkway;
- **Sidewalks** – Place the snow onto your property as the Village does not provide this service;
- **Hydrants** – Clear the snow and ice three feet around all sides of hydrants to provide access in the case of an emergency.

Keep in mind that shoveling, blowing, or plowing snow into the street creates hazardous driving conditions, negates the effort of our snowplowing operations, and is prohibited by law. Please be careful when moving heavy snow.

► Winter Weather Parking Restrictions

Parking on all Village streets is prohibited when 2 or more inches of snow has fallen or is predicted to fall. Parking is also prohibited on both sides of the street for 24 hours after the snowfall stops or until the clearing operation is complete.

► Drive Safely and Remember to Yield

Remember to drive cautiously and yield to snow removal equipment and emergency vehicles.

Don't Let Your Pipes Freeze This Winter!

During the winter season, please be aware of the potential for water pipes to freeze during extremely cold weather. The tips below can help decrease the potential of your pipes freezing, water damage, and costly repairs.

- Shut outside vents in crawl spaces. Many homes, especially older ones, have water pipes that pass right next to outside vents, which increases the risk of freezing.
- When the weather outside is consistently below freezing, open cabinet doors and closet doors where there are pipes. This allows the heat in your home to get to the pipes and reduces the risk of freezing.
- In extremely cold weather, allow a trickle of water to run from your faucets to maintain flow through pipes near exterior walls.
- Know the locations of the “shut-off” valves in your home. Many fixtures including toilets, sinks, and hot water heaters have an individual shut-off valve.
- If a leak occurs, turn off the water at the main shut-off.
- If a pipe freezes, use a hair dryer to help thaw the pipe. Do not use torches or heat guns in any circumstance. ■
