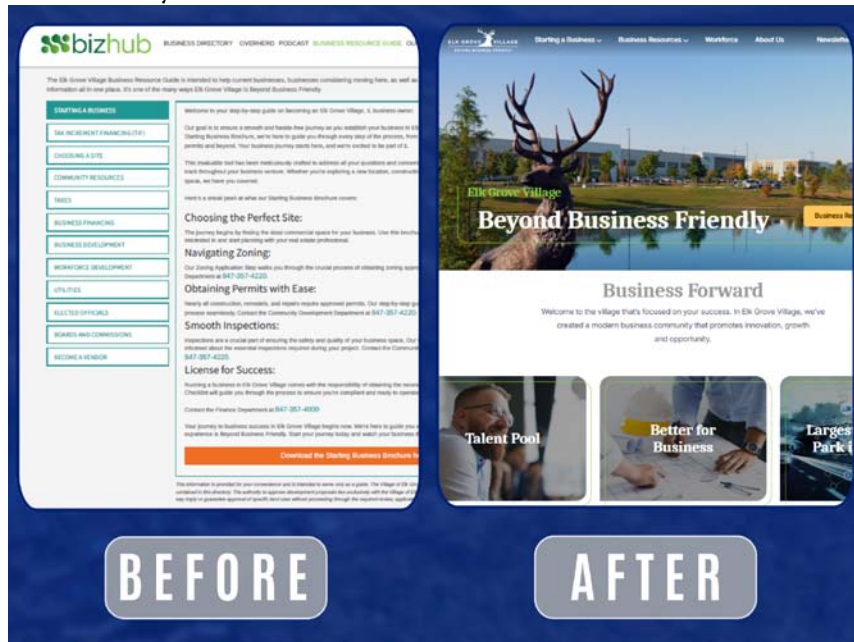

Elk Grove Village Police Department Earns Tenth Accreditation from CALEA

The Elk Grove Village Police Department has earned Advanced Law Enforcement Accreditation for the tenth time, a prestigious recognition from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. (CALEA). The department received this honor on November 16, 2024, following a rigorous multi-year assessment of its policies, community engagement, and facilities.

As one of the top five percent of accredited agencies nationwide, the department has maintained CALEA accreditation since 1993, demonstrating its commitment to excellence. Police Chief David Dorn, Deputy Chief Scott Eisenmenger, and Police Services Administrator Bolor Bat-Erdem attended the CALEA conference in Jacksonville, Florida, where the decision was finalized.

In addition to its 10th accreditation, the department received CALEA's Advanced Meritorious Award for its longstanding dedication. This achievement highlights the department's commitment to transparency, community trust, and best practices in public safety. ■

Paint Recycling Soon To Be Available Statewide!

The State of Illinois recently passed the Illinois Paint Stewardship Act to start a statewide program that will make it easy and convenient for residents and businesses to recycle their leftover paint at designated drop-off locations. The Illinois paint stewardship program will be managed by PaintCare, a nonprofit organization, and is planned for implementation in 2025.

In light of the upcoming implementation of the PaintCare paint recycling program, the Village has discontinued the annual one-day Paint and Motor Oil Collection event for the foreseeable future.

Where will I be able to recycle paint?

The PaintCare plan for Illinois will be developed over the next year. As more information is available about where paint recycling drop-off locations will be, the information will be published in the Villager newsletter and on the Village website.

Will I need to pay to recycle my paint?

No. There will not be a charge to drop off paint at a future designated drop-off site.

Where can I take my used motor oil? Will I need to pay?

Motor oil and other automotive fluids are typically accepted for safe disposal or recycling at auto parts and hardware stores. You can recycle used motor oil at no charge and at your convenience at these nearby locations:

AutoZone Auto Parts - 68 Biesterfield Road, Elk Grove Village IL (Biesterfield Road and Arlington Heights Road)

O'Reilly Auto Parts - 809 N Roselle Road, Roselle IL (Roselle Road and Nerge Road)

National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day

The 28th National Drug Take-Back Day is Saturday, April 26!

If you have medications you no longer need, haven't used, or that have expired, bring them to the Police Department lobby (901 Wellington Ave) between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. Needles, sharps, and liquids will not be accepted.

If you're unable to participate in the event, prescription drugs can be accepted 24/7 through the drug drop-off box in the lobby.

Avoid Feeding Local Wildlife

A friendly reminder to residents that **feeding wildlife is prohibited in Elk Grove Village**, with the exception of elevated bird feeders.

Feeding local wildlife, such as ducks, geese, squirrels, and other animals, might seem like a kind gesture, but it can do more harm than good.

Human food such as bread and crackers is unhealthy for local critters and can lead to malnutrition, obesity, or other health issues. Animals are adapted to search for their own natural food sources that provide the nutrients they need, and do so just fine on their own. Some human foods can even be toxic to animals as well.

Regular feeding encourages animals to rely on humans for food, which weakens their natural survival instincts and encourages them to congregate. Overcrowding due to human feeding also increases the potential for conflicts with people, such as geese leaving droppings in public spaces or squirrels causing property damage.

For the benefit of the local wildlife and our community, it's best to admire animals from a distance and allow them to thrive in their natural habitats.

Yard Waste Program Starting April 1

Yard waste is picked up each year from April 1 to December 15. Yard waste collection takes place the same day as garbage/recycling collection. Yard waste includes leaves, brush, grass clippings, garden waste, and tree and brush trimmings.

An unlimited amount of yard waste bags or 33-gallon rigid containers (not exceeding 50 pounds in weight) will be collected curbside each week as long as a prepaid yard waste sticker (\$3) is affixed to each container. **Plastic bags may not be used for any yard waste**, and will not be picked up by Groot.

Beware of text message scams falsely claiming that you owe money for unpaid tolls. Do not click on any links or attachments in the message, and delete the message immediately. **These are not legitimate messages from the Illinois Tollway!**

If you are concerned about an unpaid toll fee, check your account online at illinoistollway.com or call the official Illinois Tollway customer service line at 800-824-7277 anytime Monday to Friday, between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. ■

The Toll Roads Notice of Toll Evasion: You have an unpaid toll bill on your account. To avoid late fees, pay within 12 hours or the late fees will be increased and reported to the DMV.

Special Spring Leaf Collection - Monday, April 7

The special spring curbside leaf collection for all residents is scheduled to begin on Monday, April 7.

Public Works will make only one pass through all residential areas. Please be aware that it will take several days to collect all the leaves throughout the community.

Important Leaf Collection Rules:

- **Place your leaves on the street by 7 a.m. on Monday, April 7.** This deadline applies to all households throughout the Village (regardless of your leaf zone). Leaves placed after the deadline will not be collected.
- Only rake leaves into the street. Grass, branches, and other yard waste are NOT permitted and will damage Village equipment.
- Place leaves in a continuous row on the pavement approximately 2 feet from the curb.
- Do not place leaves on state or county roadways, nor on the following streets: Tonne Road, Elk Grove Boulevard, Rev. Morrison Boulevard, J.F. Kennedy Boulevard, Biesterfield Road, and Wise Road. Residents on these streets should put leaves in the parkway.
- Please do not park on the street from 7 a.m. on April 7 until all leaves are removed from your street.
- In the event of rain, you should still place your leaves in the street. Leaves will be collected as soon as possible.
- In the event of snow, leaf collection will be rescheduled for another day.

Spring Large Branch Collection - Monday, April 28

The Village appreciates residents' efforts to maintain their property and recognizes that disposing of tree debris from winter cleanup may be difficult. Therefore, the Public Works Department has a Spring Large Branch Collection Program to assist residents.

Public Works will make only one pass through all residential areas beginning Monday, April 28.

Important Branch Collection Rules:

- Large branches 3 ½ to 8 inches in diameter from all trees and bushes, except evergreens, are eligible for pick-up.
- **Residents MUST Contact Public Works at (847) 734-8800 to have your address listed for pickup.** Calls can be made Monday through Friday between the hours of 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. and must be received no later than Friday, April 25 at 4 p.m.
- Branches must be stacked in the parkway with cut ends pointing towards the curb.
- The following items are NOT part of the collection program: logs, lumber, paneling, bushes, stumps, and evergreens. These items damage Village equipment. Please contact Groot at (847) 734-6400 for pickup guidelines regarding these items.
- Branches should be placed in the parkway no sooner than the weekend before the designated pickup week.

As a reminder, the Groot Yard Waste Program includes the removal of bagged yard waste and small branch pickup. This program operates from April 1 through December 15. Bundled branches up to 3 ½ inches in diameter, and no more than 4 feet in length, will be picked up by Groot free of charge. Please note that yard waste bag collection requires purchase of a yard waste sticker per bag. ■

Working Smoke Detectors Save Lives!

Smoke detectors play a critical role in home fire safety by providing early warnings that can save lives. The Elk Grove Village Fire Department urges all residents to ensure their smoke detectors are in proper working condition.

Residents should test their smoke detectors monthly, replace the batteries at least once a year, and replace the entire unit every ten years. Additionally, smoke detectors should be installed in every bedroom, outside sleeping areas, and on every level of the home.

Through the Be Alarmed program, the Fire Department provides free smoke detectors and installation assistance to eligible residents. For more information or to schedule an installation, please contact the Fire Department at 847-734-8000. ■

2025 Village Construction

The Village is pleased to announce the projects planned for this year's construction season, prioritized and designed to meet the infrastructure needs of the Village. The Public Works Department will be managing these projects and striving to minimize adverse impacts from construction. Roadway Maintenance Program

Street Resurfacing Program

This year's Street Resurfacing Program consists of resurfacing 9.2 miles of streets, pavement patching, rehabilitation of curbs and sidewalks, and improvements to accessible curb ramps. These construction activities are generally broken down into four phases:

Phase I (Storm Sewer)	Phase II (Concrete)	Phase III (Pavement)	Phase IV (Restoration)
Necessary repairs and/or modifications are made to drainage structures.	Replacement of deteriorated curbs and sidewalks, generally limited to one side of the street at a time.	Full depth pavement patching, milling the existing pavement, paving the new asphalt, and painting pavement markings.	Final restoration of all disturbed areas to be completed.

Friendly reminder: Fresh oil is applied prior to laying the new pavement layer as a bonding agent between the asphalt layers. Motorists must travel slowly on the fresh oil.

Business Park Street Resurfacing

The following 2.2 miles of roadways in the Business Park are scheduled for resurfacing between July and mid-September:

Bennett Road , Arlington Heights Road to King Street	Estes Avenue , Busse Road to Elmhurst Road
Bonnie Lane , Howard Street to Oakton Street	King Street , Bennett Drive to Northwest Point Boulevard

Street Preventative Maintenance

Streets that were resurfaced last year will have a preservative seal applied to them this year. The sealant (Reclamite) helps protect the roadway from deterioration caused by the weight of traffic and moisture penetrating the asphalt pavement. Reclamite is made of petroleum oils and resins that restore the asphalt's original flexibility to prevent cracking that would allow more moisture into the asphalt and accelerate the rate of deterioration.

Village-Wide Concrete Rehabilitation Program (Sidewalk and Curb)

Village-owned sidewalk at various locations that is fragmented, heaved, or sunken will be replaced. The program also replaces curb that is affecting drainage within the roadway. The rehabilitation program work is broken into a spring, summer, and fall phase.

2025 Village Construction (continued)

Improvements to Devon Avenue at Tonne Road and at Arlington Heights Road - Spring

These intersections will be resurfaced in addition to full-depth patching, curb and sidewalk replacements, and improvements to enhance safety and accessibility. Improvements include detectable warning surfaces, new Accessible Pedestrian Signals, pedestrian push buttons, countdown timers, and refreshed crosswalk markings to make crossings safer and more convenient.

Improvements to Landmeier Road at Busse Road - Summer

Landmeier Road will be resurfaced on either side of the intersection at Busse Road. The project includes full-depth patching and replacing curbs and sidewalks. Sidewalk ramps will be upgraded with detectable warning surfaces.

Improvements at the intersection include new Accessible Pedestrian Signals, pedestrian push buttons, and two new traffic signal mast arms. A new sidewalk will also be added on the south side of Landmeier Road, west of Busse Road.

Tonne Road Major Reconstruction - Fall

Significant safety-improving renovations to the intersections of Tonne Road & Elk Grove Boulevard and Tonne Road & Landmeier Road to help reduce accidents and driver confusion.

Complete removal and replacement of the pavement on Tonne Road from Landmeier Road through Elk Grove Boulevard. A new multi-use path along the median will be installed, in addition to new roadway lighting, storm sewer improvements, and new landscaping.



Water & Sewer Systems Improvements

Elmhurst Road Water Main Extension - Spring

The water main along Elmhurst Road will be improved, north of Landmeier Road. The project will improve fire protection in that area by installing new valves and fire hydrants.

Brummel Avenue Water Main Replacement - Summer

Water main and water service connections will be installed along Brummel Avenue from Lively Boulevard to Busse Road.



Brantwood Avenue Water Main Replacement - Fall

New water main, fire hydrants, valves, and service lines will be installed along Brantwood Avenue from Arlington Heights Road to John F. Kennedy Boulevard.

The current water main has reached the end of its useful life and replacing the water main will insure reliable service to our residents.

Sanitary Manhole Rehabilitation - Full Season

Approximately 100 sanitary manholes will be rehabilitated in the central portion of town to prevent rainwater intrusion into the Village's sanitary sewer system and reduce sanitary backups during heavy rain events.

Village Hall Storm Lift Station - Fall

The Village Hall Storm Lift Station will be fully rehabilitated, including new piping, pumps, control panels, and wet well lining. This project will improve and prevent Village Hall from flooding and decrease maintenance costs related to operating the infrastructure.

Oakton Street at Busse Road Gateway Fountain

A new gateway fountain at the Oakton Street/Busse Road intersection began construction in 2024. The contractor has installed all the concrete, stonework, signs, and is expected to resume when the weather improves to finish the water features, electrical hardware, and landscaping.

Environmental & Aesthetic Improvements

Arlington Heights Road Pedestrian Bridge

The Village will construct a new pedestrian bridge spanning across Arlington Heights Road, south of Higgins Road, which will connect the new Vue mixed-use development directly to the Busse Woods Forest Preserve’s bicycle trail. The bridge will function as a gateway feature for the Village, while providing safe passage to Busse Woods. The bridge will have unique aesthetic features, such as custom fencing that emulates Village architecture like the clock tower, supporting structures that mimic trees, and a scenic overlook.



Construction is expected to begin in the spring of 2025, with construction completion anticipated in the spring of 2026.

Illinois Tollway, Cook County, and Illinois Department of Transportation Construction

York Road Reconstruction

As part of the Tollway’s I-490 project, York Road will be reconstructed from Devon Avenue at the north end to Gateway Road in Bensenville at the south end. Construction began in 2024, with roadway reconstruction from Devon Avenue to Supreme Drive, and from Foster Avenue to Gateway Road.

The Tollway anticipates reconstructing York Road from Supreme Drive to Foster Avenue in 2025, and completing the 8-foot-wide sidepath in 2026. Please visit illinoistollway.com/projects for more information on construction of Interstate 490.

Touhy Avenue and Elmhurst Road Improvements

As part of the Tollway’s I-490 project, Touhy Avenue is being reconstructed from Elmhurst Road to Mount Prospect Road. This work is being constructed in coordination with the new I-490 partial interchange at Touhy Avenue.

Work will include a temporary bypass road, a new overpass for the railroad tracks and a bridge over the proposed interstate. Old Higgins Road will be re-aligned at Elmhurst Road and reconstructed as part of the project.

The project is being led by Cook County Department of Transportation and Highways, and is anticipated to have ongoing construction until completion in 2027. Please visit cookcountyil.gov/service/highway-construction-projects for more information.

Landmeier Road Improvements

This year, Cook County plans to rehabilitate Landmeier Road from Arlington Heights Road to Higgins Road. This includes pavement patching, diamond grinding, curb and gutter removal and replacement, roadway median improvements, storm sewer installation, pavement markings, and replacement of traffic signal detector loops.

Higgins Road Resurfacing

The Illinois Department of Transportation will be resurfacing Higgins Road from the Village limits in Schaumburg to Oakton Street. This is estimated to start in the fall. ■
