Elk Grove Village Business Park ranked among the top ten industrial parks in North America

Business Facilities Magazine, a leading business location publication, has ranked the Elk Grove Village Business Park among the top ten industrial parks in North America five years in a row. This year, the Elk Grove Village Business Park was ranked #3!

Business Facilities Magazine is the primary publication serving the industrial and manufacturing site selection marketplace. In formulating its industrial park rankings this year, Business Facilities Magazine “focused on intermodal and utility capabilities, manufacturing activity, and available land/space.” The magazine also focused on the economic impact of the industrial park, based on the area in which it operates.

The recognition reinforces Elk Grove Village’s continued leadership as a premier destination for manufacturers, high-tech, and advanced industrial users. Over the last five years, the Village has invested \$29 million in the Business Park, with the bulk of that investment going towards infrastructure and public works improvements to provide an environment where manufacturers and businesses can operate efficiently.

The Elk Grove Village Business Park is the nation’s largest industrial park, with over 66 million square feet of inventory, 5,600 businesses, and over 400 manufacturers. ■

Business Ambassador Visit: Highland Vans

On May 7, Village officials visited Highland Vans, located at 872 Cambridge Drive, as part of the Business Ambassador program. During the visit, the Business Ambassador Team met with brothers Szymon and Karol to discuss the company’s growth and tour its Elk Grove Village facility.

Founded by three brothers, Highland Vans began by building its first custom camper van in a backyard before moving into a 1,000-square-foot facility that the company outgrew within one summer. Today, Highland Vans operates from a 5,000-square-foot facility, where the team transforms vans into luxury mobile living spaces designed for travel, adventure, and full-time living.

The company’s custom builds include features such as solar power, Starlink internet, kitchens, bathrooms, heating and cooling systems, and off-grid power capabilities. The visit gave officials an opportunity to learn more about Highland Vans’ hands-on craftsmanship, entrepreneurial growth, and continued investment in Elk Grove. ■

Fall Leaf Collection Begins Monday, September 28

During the months of October and November, the Public Works Department offers residents convenient disposal of their fall leaves on a weekly basis. Leaf collection will begin on Monday, September 28 and conclude on Wednesday, November 25.

Elk Grove Village is divided into nine (9) collection sections and each section receives nine (9) leaf collection dates. The scheduled collection dates and a map depicting the section numbers are shown on page 7.

Please note that during the week of Thanksgiving, the sections regularly scheduled for Thursday and Friday will be shifted to the first part of the week.

Important Program Rules:

- Leaves should be raked into the street after 3 p.m. the day before collection and before 7 a.m. the day of collection.
- Only rake leaves into the street. Grass, branches, and other yard waste are NOT permitted and will damage Village equipment.
- Place leaves in a continuous row on the pavement approximately 2 feet from the curb.

- Do not place leaves on state or county roadways, nor on the following Village streets: Tonne Road, Oakton Street, Elk Grove Boulevard, Rev. Morrison Boulevard, J.F. Kennedy Boulevard, Biesterfeld Road, and Wise Road. Residents along these streets are asked to place leaves in the parkway.

- In the event of rain, you should still place your leaves in the street. Leaves will be collected as soon as possible.

- In the event of snow, leaf pickup will be rescheduled for another day. Additionally, any leaves that are placed on the street and not picked up by the initial collection will eventually be collected by crews at a later date.

- Street parking is prohibited from 7 a.m. on the day of collection until leaves are removed.

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Mayor Johnson Shares Updates on Data Centers

At last month's Village Board Meeting, a few residents asked questions about data centers and the WGN property along Rohlwing Road.

The WGN property is the site of a potential data center development, which the Village annexed after partnering with neighboring residents to prevent a more intensive, truck-heavy industrial use from being developed outside of Village control.

At the Board Meeting, Mayor Johnson provided background on how the Village approached this development to minimize impact to adjacent homes, as well as the Village's hopes for the site.

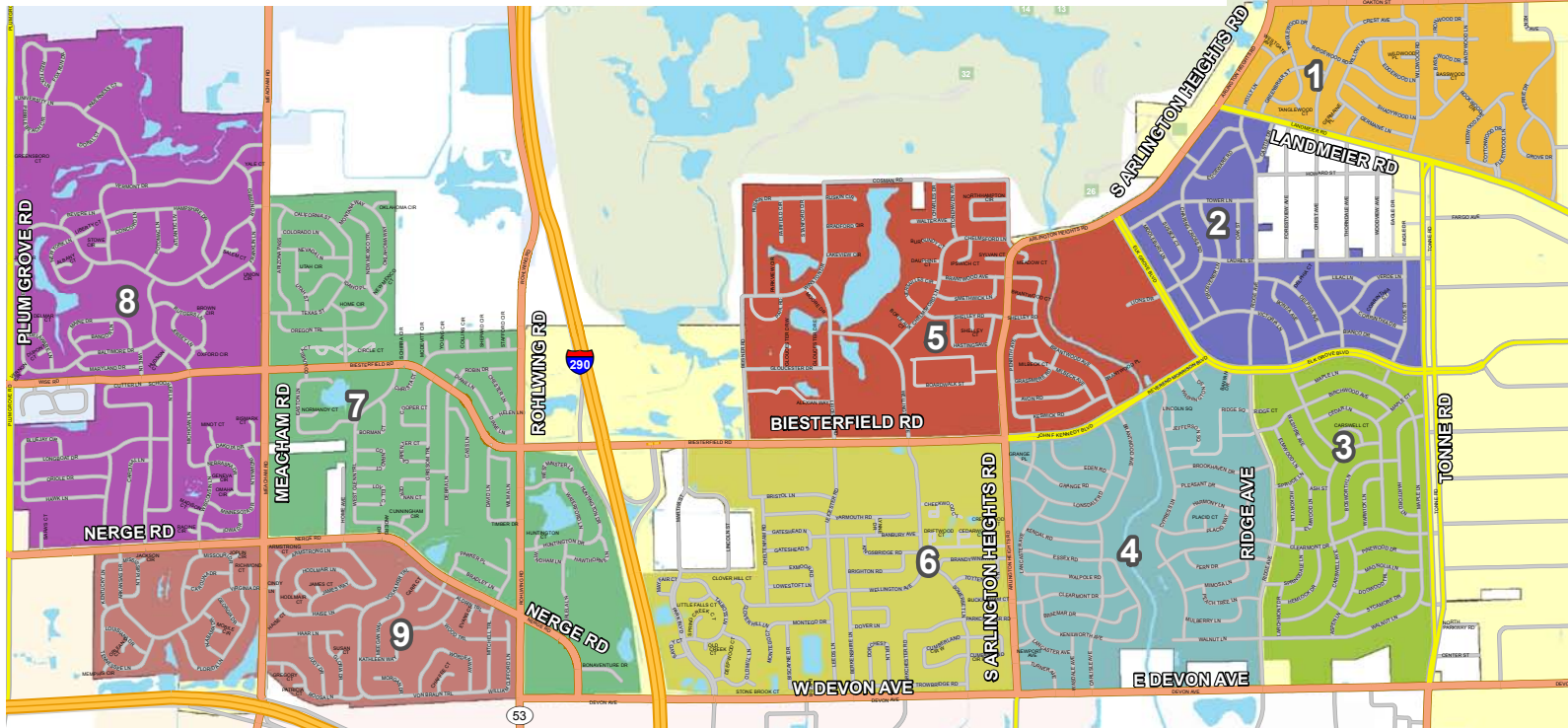

Elk Grove Village Named 2025 Tree City USA

Elk Grove Village has been named a 2025 Tree City USA community by the Arbor Day Foundation. The Tree City USA program recognizes excellence in urban forestry management and environmental improvement. A city only achieves this designation if they have a tree board or department, establishes a community tree ordinance, spends at least \$2 per capita on urban forestry, and celebrates Arbor Day. The Village has continually gone above and beyond by not only meeting these criteria, but by offering tree evaluations, planting trees, and providing outstanding care. Since 2017, Elk Grove Village has planted approximately 4,545 trees throughout the community in total, and currently plants around 500 trees per year.

This is the 41st consecutive year that Elk Grove Village has received the Tree City USA designation. Over the years, the Village has continually demonstrated an exceptional commitment to maintaining a robust urban forest, which has contributed to environmental health as well as the aesthetic pride of the community. ■

Fall Large Branch Collection - Monday, September 21

The Village appreciates our resident's efforts to maintain their property and recognizes that disposing of tree debris from summer cleanup may be difficult. Therefore, the Public Works Department has a Large Branch Collection Program to assist residents.

Important Large Branch Collection Program Rules:

- Large branches 3 ½ to 8 inches in diameter from all trees and bushes, except evergreens are eligible for pick-up (not bundled with twine).
- Residents **MUST** contact Public Works at 847-734-8800 Monday through Friday between the hours of 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. to get your address listed for pickup. Calls must be received no later than 4 p.m. on Friday, September 18.
- Branches must be stacked in the parkway with cut ends pointing towards the curb.
- Branches should be placed in the parkway no sooner than the weekend before the designated pickup week.

The following items are **NOT** part of the collection program: logs, lumber, paneling, bushes, stumps, and evergreens as these items damage Village equipment. Please contact Groot at 847-734-6400 for pickup guidelines regarding these items.

Homeowners are reminded that the Groot Yard Waste Program includes the removal of bagged yard waste April 1 through December 15. Branches must be bundled with biodegradable twine or string. Branches up to 3 ½ inches in diameter and no more than 4 feet in length or over 50 pounds in weight will be picked up by Groot **FREE** of charge. Please note that using yard waste bags require the purchase of a yard waste sticker. ■

As part of the 70th Anniversary celebrations, we are sharing the history of our beloved community.

ELK GROVE SCHOOLS

Elk Grove's first school was Elk Grove Consolidated School, more popularly known as Higgins School, located at the intersection of Higgins and Elmhurst Roads. Built on property donated by Friedrich William Behrens, a wooden one-room, single-teacher schoolhouse provided education to the surrounding farmers' children from 1897 until it burned down in 1899. It was replaced with a brick structure a year later.

Increased enrollment by 1925 prompted the construction of a larger, two story brick building slightly to the west of the original site which became an important community center thanks to the first floor auditorium. Following the Second World War, Elk Grove Township saw a consolidation of its various small schools into today's District 59.

Taking over for elementary school aged kids was Rupley Elementary which opened in 1957 and is now the oldest school in Elk Grove Village. Rupley was named for Centex Executive Vice President, Ira Rupley, whose company planned and built Elk Grove Village in the 1950s and donated funds to build the school. Despite its eight classrooms, Rupley was already too small when it opened in November 1957.

Two schools opened in the same area along Elk Grove Boulevard within a year of each other. Queen of the Rosary Catholic School opened in 1959, then Grove Junior High School opened the following year in 1960. Grove Junior High began with an initial student body of 450 led by Principal Jack Burns. From the beginning, Grove Junior High stood out with excellent programs, particularly its award-winning jazz and concert band program which was led by Director John Janusek from 1966–2009. Interestingly, for a time starting in 1965, there was a dual enrollment program where students at Queen of the Rosary would spend the morning at either Grove or Queen of the Rosary, then switch to the other in the afternoon.

The Elk Grove Village elementary students who reside on the west side of Route 53 are serviced by District 54. There are two D54 elementary schools in Elk Grove Village: Stevenson Elementary and Link Elementary. The Elk Grove Village middle school age students in District 54 attend Margaret Mead Junior High, which is ranked #33 in Illinois middle schools, serving more than 600 seventh and eighth graders. Mead was named after Margaret Mead, an anthropologist known for her studies of how culture influences the development of personality.

Through two different school districts – District 214 and District 211, Elk Grove Village has two high schools that serve the community – James B. Conant High School (Conant) and Elk Grove High School (EGHS). High school students who live west of I-290 attend Conant and students who live east of I-290 attend EGHS. Conant opened in 1964 and was named after James Bryant Conant, a chemist, educator, and leading authority on teacher's education.

Elk Grove High School opened in 1966. EGHS jumped in attendance from around 1,300 students in the 1985–86 school year to just over 2,200 for the 1987–88 school year following the closure of Forest View High School. When EGHS opened its doors in 1966, the leadership was under Principal Robert Haskell, who served until 1974 and is still honored today as the namesake of Haskell Stadium. Currently, Elk Grove High School has an enrollment of 1,976 students, and it celebrates its 50th anniversary this year in 2026.

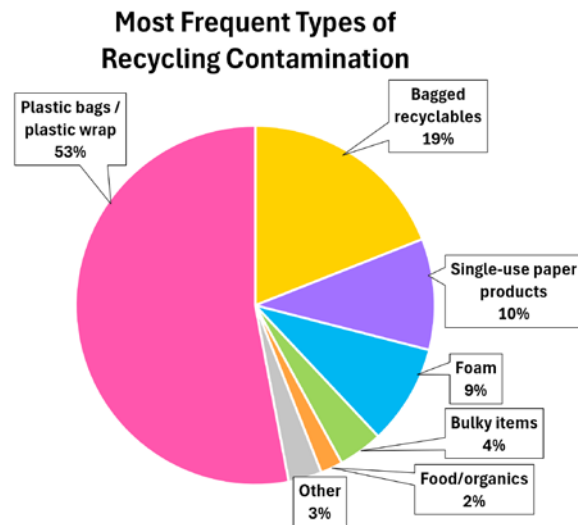


Insights from the Recycling Cart Tagging Program

The Village, in collaboration with the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC), conducted a Recycling Cart Tagging Pilot Program on 400 selected homes throughout the month of June, with an option for residents to opt-out. The purpose was to educate residents on what can and cannot be recycled in their curbside bin, in an effort to reduce contamination. Tags provided specific feedback on which, if any, unacceptable items were present.

The Most Common Recycling Mistakes

We all have good intentions when we recycle, but attempting to recycle the wrong materials causes more harm than good. Throughout the program, plastic bags and plastic wrap were the most common types of contamination. Plastic bags and wrap accounted for more than half (53%) of all contamination observed. The second most common issue was bagged recyclables (recyclable materials placed inside plastic garbage bags). Not only do plastic bags (and everything inside them) end up in a landfill anyways, but they damage the machinery at the recycling sorting facility and prevent good recyclables from making it through.



How to Help: Avoiding the Most Common Mistakes

- 1) Keep plastic bags and plastic wrap out of your curbside recycling cart. This includes plastic grocery bags, bubble wrap, chip bags, candy wrappers, and any other thin plastic materials.
- 2) Don't use plastic bags to contain recyclables. Instead, empty your bag directly into the bin or opt for an open paper bag or cardboard box.
- 3) Use the "stretch test" for special recycling. If you can stretch a thin plastic with your thumb, it can be recycled through special drop-off bins located at the entrances of many major grocery stores. These bins accept plastic grocery bags, clean sandwich bags, and produce bags. Non-stretchable plastics like chip bags or candy wrappers are trash.
