New Business Licensing Year Effective June 1

A new licensing year is effective June 1, 2022, for businesses to renew licensing or register as a new applicant. Businesses conducting retail sales of any product or merchandise require a license. Other businesses requiring a business license include, but are not limited to; building contractors, day care centers and food caterers. In addition, all coin-operated devices must also display a valid 2022-2023 license.

Pre-printed license applications for businesses currently licensed will be mailed four weeks prior to the respective renewal date. Businesses can enter license renewal payment on our Customer Self-Service portal at css.elkgrove.org/css. Register for an account, sign-in, and complete payment using a business ID number. This method is available for renewals only.

New businesses may complete a fillable application on our website, www.elkgrove.org/businesslicense. Please note that a business may require more than one type of business license. A zoning application will also need to be completed for new businesses, contact the Community Development Department for more information. The annual fee for a business license covers the cost of making inspections necessary to safeguard public safety, health and welfare. Failure to obtain a license can result in fines of \$50 to \$500 per day.

In September of this year, Bubby's will have been located in the same 1,100 square foot location at 1026 E. Higgins Road, in the middle of the largest industrial park in the country, for 20 years. That, while quite an achievement, is a double-edged sword.

The hot dog stand goes as the business park goes, since many of Bubby's regular customers work in Elk Grove, but don't live here. When the park is full, as it is now, business is good. But, Bubby's is only open from 10:30 AM to 4:00 PM, creating increased demand in a shorter period of time. At the same time, many Elk Grove residents can't make it between

those hours-in particular the stereotypical hot dog demographic which is instead stuck in Algebra or U.S. History class on weekdays.

So, business is even better when customers with families and many who have retired come back to share their experience.

Andy's not in the hot dog business to get rich. He genuinely loves what he does. It's unmistakable.

Decades before opening Bubby's, Andy worked at Howie's Hot Dog Hut in Morton Grove. The owner got along so well with his customers that it made a lasting impression on the 16-year old. At the time, a hot dog and french fries cost only \$1.99. Some things, like the importance of creating a memorable experience, haven't changed.

Be the Best Part of Your Customer's Day.

If you've been to Bubby's, Andy has probably cracked a joke with you or did something to make you smile. In fact, Andy sees his job similarly to a Las Vegas magician or a comedian, who performs live on stage every day.

"I like people to have a good time," Andy said. "Most people are working all the time and they don't really like their job. I love my job. I can't wait to get back to work on Monday. When people are having a bad day at work, I try to make them laugh

and brighten up their day."

And if the patented Andy Arnowitz sense of humor doesn't force a smile, the quality of the food surely will.

In July of 2021, Bubby's Beefs & Red Hots was inducted into the Vienna Beef Hot Dog Hall of Fame for its contribution to the Elk Grove Village community, philanthropic leadership, and overall commitment to the quality of its product and the satisfaction of its customers.

but they're also the top of the line. Out-oftowners who can't get Vienna beef back home and even visitors from other countries are drawn in by the recognizable Vienna sign.

Andy also doesn't sacrifice quality when it comes to Bubby's beloved fresh cut french fries. The open external kitchen allows Andy and his team to wash 600 pounds of potatoes every week and cut them in front of the customers.

2022-2023 Vehicle Stickers for Businesses due June 1

Preprinted Vehicle Sticker renewal forms were mailed to all Village businesses in April ahead of the new vehicle sticker licensing period effective June 1, 2022. In our ongoing effort to deliver exceptional customer service, the Village provides a fillable Vehicle Sticker application form found at www.elkgrove.org/vehiclesticker.

Businesses are encouraged to renew by mail or utilize the 24-hour drop box located at Village Hall.

Please see below for the vehicle sticker fee schedule:

Passenger Cars: \$25.00 Trucks: \$50.00 - \$155.00 Motorcycles: \$20.00 - \$25.00

Stickers must be displayed in the lower right-hand corner of the windshield by June 1, 2022, for new vehicles there is a thirty day grace period. Vehicle stickers may be purchased in person at the Finance Department counter, Monday through Friday 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m., and the first Saturday of every month (May – August) from 9:00 a.m. until noon, excluding holiday weekends.

Document Destruction & Electronics Recycling Event

Elk Grove Village, in conjunction with the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC), is sponsoring a Document Destruction and Electronics Recycling Event.

James Paul Petri Public Works Facility: 450 E. Devon Avenue Saturday, June 4 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

There is no cost to attend, but residents must live in one of SWANCC's member communities to participate. IDs will be checked for proof of residency. Materials from businesses, institutions, or schools will not be accepted.

To help keep lines moving, all participants are asked to follow these guidelines:

- IDs will be checked to verify residency
- Residents will unlock/open the trunk from inside the vehicle and allow staff to unload the items
- Paper documents should be contained in one area in the back of vehicle in paper bags or small boxes not in plastic bags! Boxes and bags will be returned to the resident.



Paper: Residents can bring up to three (3) file-sized boxes or paper bags of sensitive documents containing personal information, such as medical history forms, bank statements, personal files, and retired tax forms. Paper documents will be shredded on site.

Plastic spines/covers and metal clips/binders MUST BE removed from all documents. **DO NOT bring paper in plastic bags. DO NOT include photos, slides, negatives, books, store receipts, magazines, greeting cards, newspapers, or any non-paper item.**



Electronics: Please remove electronics from plastic packaging and boxes prior to the event.

Acceptable Materials: Cable receivers, cell phones, computer cables, computer monitors, computers (desktop, notebook, tablet), converter boxes, desktop fax machines and printers, keyboards, mice, MP3 players, portable digital assistants (PDAs), satellite receivers, scanners, televisions, video game consoles, video recorders/players, and zip drives.

Voluntary Village-Wide Cross-Connection Control Survey

The Village will be conducting a voluntary crossconnection survey of all water customers in June. As a water supplier, the Village of Elk Grove is required by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) to conduct this survey every three years as part of a crossconnection control program.

A cross-connection is simply a plumbing connection between a drinking supply and a non-drinking water source (e.g. fire sprinkler system, irrigation system, boiler) where contaminants could potentially enter the water supply. Wherever a potential cross-connection exists, the IEPA requires a device to prevent a connection between a drinking supply and a non-drinking water source. This cross-connection program is designed to protect our drinking water.

The Village has contracted with Aqua Backflow to assist with the cross-connection program, including the upcoming survey. Residents and businesses will receive a postcard survey in the mail within the next few weeks. The survey is voluntary and only takes a few moments to complete. We ask that you follow directions on the postcard and complete the survey within 30 days. If you currently have or require a backflow protection

device, the IEPA requires that you have your backflow device tested annually at your own expense. As part of this voluntary survey, Aqua Backflow will request that respondents who report backflow devices provide results from their annual backflow device test.



If you report a cross connection on the voluntary survey, you may be required to complete testing or plumbing repairs at your own expense. If you have questions or concerns about cross-connections or backflow testing, please contact Aqua Backflow by telephone at 847-742-2296 or via email at info@AquaBackflow.com with any questions or concerns.

This program is designed to safeguard our drinking water and to protect public health. The survey is optional, but we ask for your assistance with our cross connection program and any requests for information that come from Aqua Backflow or Village staff.

Be Aware & Park with Care - Sidewalk Parking Courtesy

Maintaining access to sidewalks throughout our community ensures that everyone can get around with ease. Sidewalks blocked by vehicles can present problems to pedestrians, strollers, bicyclists, and people who rely on wheelchairs or motorized vehicles to get around, especially during the warmer months. Residents may find themselves forced from the sidewalk into the street due to vehicles parked across the sidewalk in driveways.

When possible, practice parking courtesy by keeping sidewalks open for your neighbors. Please remember to be aware and park with care! ■

Receive a Credit for Watering Your Parkway Tree

The Tree Watering Program is a voluntary program available to all residents who had a parkway tree replaced during the previous year. For example, trees planted in the spring or fall of 2021 are eligible for the program. The program provides residents with a \$25 water bill credit in exchange for assisting the Public Works Department in watering a parkway tree that was planted in the fall or spring of the previous year. Public Works crews will place a tree bag on the parkway tree and then the participating resident will need to add water to the bag twice per week. This is roughly equivalent to 40 gallons of water over the course of the program. A \$25 credit will appear on a resident's water bill on October/November, after the program has been completed.



By participating in the program, you can contribute to the health and growth of the urban forest and build a more sustainable community. Village Board Approves Fiscal Year 2023 Budget

Last month, the Mayor and Village Board approved the Fiscal Year 2023 Budget in the amount of \$173,143,527. The General Fund budget, which provides for Village operations

and contains most of the Village's traditional services such as Fire, Police, and Public Works, was approved at \$65,879,707. This represents an increase of 1.17% from the previous fiscal year (with pension pass-throughs and transfers removed).

The industrial vacancy rate today is at 1.85% - an all-time low, which marks six consecutive years that the Village has sustained a vacancy rate below 5%. As a result of

this strong business climate, positive General Fund revenues were able to help offset revenues negatively impacted by the pandemic, such as the food and beverage industry and

hospitality. In addition, a balanced budget has been established to maintain the rising costs of goods and services in 2022.


The FY2023 adopted budget continues a commitment to maintaining exceptional standards and fiscal responsibility. The budget also includes a continuation of our community events and public education outreach programs as we look forward to engage with the community once again.

Bicycle and Motorcycle Safety Tips

May is safety awareness month for bicyclists and motorcyclists! With the increasing temperatures, more members of our community are getting outside to ride their bicycles and motorcycles. To keep everyone safe, the Elk Grove Village Police Department is urging motorists to be mindful of them on the roads.

For safe cycling, bicyclists should always:

- Wear a properly-fitted helmet for safety that meets the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) standards. The CPSC standards are available at www.cpsc.gov.
- Obey the same traffic laws, signs and signals that apply to motorists. Illinois bicycle rules of the road can be found on the Illinois Secretary of State website at www.ilsos.gov.
- Ride in the same direction as other traffic, not against traffic.

- Be aware of your surroundings at all times and do not use electronic devices.
- Never cycle distracted or impaired.

Bicyclists must also obey the following rules when riding on sidewalks, where it is permitted:

- When walking or riding your bicycle on a sidewalk or along a crosswalk, you must obey all pedestrian signs and signals.
- Bicyclists must yield the right of way to pedestrians on sidewalks or crosswalks.
- Slowdown and go around pedestrians when possible.
- When approaching a pedestrian from behind, slow down and give an audible signal to alert of your presence before passing them.

For safe riding, motorcyclists should always:

- Conduct a motorcycle safety-check to make sure it is in a proper running condition.
- Wear personal protective gear on every ride, including eye protection, gloves, jackets, pants, boots and a U.S.
 Department of Transportation (DOT) approved helmet.
- Wear high-visibility clothing.

- Never ride distracted or impaired.
- Take advantage of the free motorcycle training classes throughout the state. Visit the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) website at <u>idot.illinois.gov</u> for more information. ■

Groot Service Reminders

As Groot continues to provide waste and recycling services to residents, keep in mind the following reminders when it comes to additional services that are provided to residents:

Free Curbside Electronics Recycling:



Groot offers free curbside electronic recycling by appointment. Residents can recycle up to two electronic waste items weighing less than 50 pounds each week. To schedule a pick-up, residents must contact Groot at 847-734-6400

at least 24 hours before their collection day. Please note that items that exceed 50 pounds will require a fee.

Free Bulk Item Pick-up:

Residents may dispose of one bulk item (under 50 pounds) per week on their regular collection day at no additional cost. Bulk items are items too large to fit inside a waste cart that weighs 50 pounds or less and can be lifted by one driver without assistance. Examples of bulk items include barrels, crates, furniture, and mattresses.





Oversized/ Overweight Item Pick-up:

For oversized or extra heavy items (exceeding 50 pounds), residents are required to schedule a special pick-up because they require two or more people to lift. A per-item fee will apply for each oversized item. To schedule a pick-up in advance,

please contact Groot at 847-734-6400.

White Goods/ Appliances:

Residents must call to schedule a special collection for white goods or appliance pick-up. Please call Groot in advance of your regular collection day at 847-734-6400 to schedule a pick-up at \$50.00 per item. After scheduling a pick-up, please note that white goods or appliances should not be placed at the curb until the evening before the scheduled collection. Catalytic Converter Theft

Catalytic converter theft is still on the rise around the nation. It is an essential part of your vehicle, designed to reduce the pollutants and toxic gas that your emissions system produces. Thieves steal catalytic converters to sell the precious metals found inside. Please remember the following tips to avoid being a victim:

- Catalytic converters are typically removed using power saws—be aware if you hear a power saw. If you see a theft in progress, do not confront the offender(s) and call 9-1-1 immediately.
- Park in well-lit areas and close to building entrances that others can easily see.
- If you have a garage, park your car inside and keep the garage door shut.
- Consider installing motion-sensitive lights and cameras that cover your parking area.
- Consider installing an anti-theft device on your catalytic converter, available online or in-store for self-installation, or contact your preferred automotive service provider for inquiries.
- Mark your catalytic converter with a brightly colored, high-temperature spray paint which can reduce its resale value.
- Etching your license plate or VIN into your catalytic converter may also help deter thieves.
- Make sure your vehicle is insured against catalytic converter theft as the replacement can be costly.

If you're a victim of catalytic converter theft, please call your local law enforcement to file a report and contact your insurance company to file a claim.

Help Keep Our Stormwater Clean!

Stormwater is rainwater that runs off rooftops, lawns, driveways, and streets into our stormwater system. As the stormwater flows over surfaces, it picks up dirt, leaves, grass clippings, pesticides and fertilizers, oil, and other harmful contaminants. All of these pollutants are carried by stormwater into storm drains and ultimately into our creeks, rivers, and in large bodies of water such as Lake Michigan. However, there are a few simple ways that residents and businesses can all help reduce the amount of pollutants that enter our waterways.



- Do not dump motor oil, antifreeze, or other hazardous materials on the ground or into sewers. Recycling programs are available for these hazardous materials, and many service stations accept used motor oil for recycling.
- When cleaning your driveway, dock, or parking lots, use a broom instead of water and dispose of debris in the trash; not in the street or storm sewer.
- Do not dump branches, leaves, or grass clippings along creek beds, in open ditches, or in the street.

- Minimize the use or herbicides, pesticides, and fertilizers on your lawn and plant native plants whenever feasible.
- Pick up litter and place it into trash cans. This will prevent it from getting washed into the storm sewers and eventually into our waterways.
- Cover piles of dirt and wood mulch while doing landscaping projects, and sweep up debris (no not wash it into the street).
